“Electric City Bike Rescue is an all-volunteer community where bicycle repairs and maintenance skills are shared in a creative and supportive environment. Services are available to anyone with a desire to learn.

Volunteer-led programs focus on rescuing, repairing, and redistributing abandoned and little-used bicycles that would otherwise be destined for landfills. These bicycles are used as tools to teach self-empowerment, and promote sustainable transportation.”

A New Community Bicycle Shop Comes to Schenectady

Bicycle enthusiasts and other volunteers from around the greater Schenectady area have come together recently to create an all-volunteer community bike shop. We are building a space where bicycle repairs and maintenance happen in a creative and supportive environment that is available to everyone. Volunteers are working to build "Electric City Bike Rescue" into a resource for the community that will offer programs focused around rescuing, repairing, and redistributing abandoned and unused bicycles that would otherwise be destined for landfills or scrap yards.

As we move forward, volunteers at "Electric City Bike Rescue" will be developing programs that will provide participants of all ages a way to learn bicycle repair and maintenance skills, or perhaps acquire a bicycle at little or no cost. The goal is to allow easy access to second hand bicycles that can be used as a healthier active play alternative for children, or self-sustained alternative transportation for others.

We are actively seeking new volunteers and donations of bikes, parts, tools, etc., to help set up our shop. Open Shop Nights

Once a week we allow access to our shop, tools, and supplies and provide a place anyone can use to fix and maintain their own bicycles. Volunteer mechanics are available for assistance, so wrenching skills are not as important as the desire to learn.
